

THE WATER TOWER



While waiting for your train, you can visit the new Visitor Centre at the end of Platform 4 and step back into the railway's history. The Engine Shed is more than just a museum; it's a place where the mechanical meets the magical. Our exhibition delves deep into the workings of steam locomotives, from their intricate engineering to the skilled hands that brought them to life. You'll discover the meticulous process of building a steam engine—from the initial designs on the drawing board to the hands-on craftsmanship in the workshop.



The exhibition also explores the enduring fascination with steam locomotives, a passion shared by generations of children and adults alike, whether through playing with model railways or watching the real thing in action.

AFTERNOON TEA

The tradition of Afternoon Tea dates back more than 200 years, to a time before steam-powered train travel was invented. Now that the steam age has been gone, both are celebrated at the Keighley & Worth Valley!

Afternoon tea' refers to a quintessentially British tradition established by Anna, the Duchess of Bedford, in the 19th century. 
