The Engine Shed is more than just a museum; it's a place where the mechanical meets the magical. Our exhibition delves deep into the workings of steam locomotives, from their intricate engineering to the skilled hands that brought them to life. You'll discover the meticulous process of building a steam engine—from the initial designs on the drawing board to the hands-on craftsmanship in the workshop.



The exhibition also explores the enduring fascination with steam locomotives, a passion shared by generations of children and adults alike, whether through playing with model railways or watching the real thing in action.

## 'THE RAILWAY CHILDREN' STATION

OAKWORTH

Remember Mr Perks and that emotional "Daddy, my Daddy" moment from the 1970 film *The Railway Children*? If so, Oakworth Station is a must-visit. Nestled between Damems and Haworth, it served as the main filming location for Lionel Jeffries' much-loved adaptation of E. Nesbit's novel, and its atmosphere still carries the spirit of the film today.
